Dear Parent(s) or Guardian:

Heartland AEA will conduct its annual Hearing Conservation program during the upcoming school year.

Students in kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th grades will receive a hearing screening.

Students who do NOT pass this screening will receive a repeat screening and may receive individual hearing tests by a Heartland AEA audiologist and consultation with school personnel. You will be notified about the results of the hearing test if your child does NOT pass the test. This is a screening process only and does not identify all hearing or ear problems. If your child has had hearing or ear problems recently, feel free to send this information to the school nurse for the audiologist.

If you do not want your child to participate in the screening program and follow-up assessments by an audiologist, please notify the school. If there are any questions about the hearing testing program in your school, please contact your school nurse [961.9560, Ext. 6132] or principal.
