Influenza Recommendations for Schools

Influenza Control and Other Respiratory Outbreaks

If you get the flu:

- Stay home from work or school
- Get plenty of rest and water
- Over-the-counter medications may relieve symptoms
- Consult your health care provider

How can you prevent the flu? The single best way to prevent the flu is to get vaccinated each year. The "flu" shot is an inactivated vaccine (containing killed influenza virus) that is injected. The flu shot is approved for use in people six months of age and older, including healthy people and people with chronic medical conditions.

Symptoms of influenza include:

- Fever (typically ≥100° F)
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- Dry cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle aches

- Headache Fever Rumy nose Body ache Sore throat
- Stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea, also can occur but are more common in children than adults

The spread of influenza Flu viruses mainly spread from person to person through coughing or sneezing. Sometimes people may become infected by touching something with flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or nose. Most healthy adults may be able to infect others beginning one day before symptoms develop and up to five to seven days after becoming sick. That means that you may be able to pass on the flu to someone else before you know you are sick, as well as while you are sick.



The following are key intervention measures for schools to reduce transmission and potentially contain outbreaks of influenza and other respiratory diseases:

- Encourage students, staff, and parents to get a yearly flu vaccine.
- Encourage students and staff to cover coughs and sneezes. Teach students and staff to cover their mouths when coughing or sneezing into upper arm or a tissue.
- Increase cleaning. Routinely clean surfaces that are commonly touched including desks, doorknobs, computer keyboards, stair handrails, and faucets.
- Stay home when ill. Any employee, student, teacher, or staff suspected of having influenza should not attend school.
- Hand washing. Teach and encourage children and staff to wash hands regularly with warm water and soap. Important times to wash hands are before and after eating, recess, gym class and every other situation involving frequent student-to-student interaction.
- Use hand sanitizer.

Guidelines for Indoor Recess:

If the temperature and/or feels-like temperature is 10° or less, students stay inside for recess.

Students will also come into the building starting at 7:30 in the morning.





Cell Phones/Electronic Communication Devices

Students may possess a cellular telephone or other electronic communication devices (ECD) in school and at school related functions provided that **during school hours** and **on school vehicles** the **cell phone or ECD is powered off, concealed and not in use**. <u>Students are prohibited from using a cell phone or having it powered on during the school day.</u>

- Cell Phones are not to be turned on, seen, heard or used in the school building or on school grounds until the dismissal bell at the end of the school day. Lesson plans that require student use of cell phones will be approved by the administration.
- Students are not permitted to wear or display their cell phone. Devices must be kept out of sight in a backpack, locker, purse or pocket.
- Cell phones may not be on or otherwise used in the school locker rooms or restrooms. This includes the use of picture/video features available on some phones.
- Cell phones may not be used on school buses without the permission of a school employee.
- The district is not responsible for the loss, theft, damage or vandalism to student's cell phone or ECD as well as student property.


Irving Book Fair Coming Soon
