# Irving Elementary PTO Meeting 01/07/2019-7:00pm

## Welcome

PTO President Danielle Burrows called the meeting to order at 7:00pm, 16 people attended.
Approval of October Meeting Minutes
Danielle Burrows presented the November 2018 PTO Meeting Minutes. Susan Krisko made a motion to approve the November Meeting Minutes and Brad Green seconded the motion.

Treasurers Report
Treasurer Stacia Kleene handed out the budget report. We received an additional \$350 from Hy-Vee for receipts and $\$ 647$ from Box tops. The supplies that PTO approved last year (i.e. cafeteria storage bins, refrigerator) has been purchased. Susan Krisko made a motion to approve the budget and Jolene Crouse seconded the motion.

Principals Report
Mr. Morris reported the Year Round calendar has been created and approved by the School Board. The schedule is slightly different from past years with have the two weeks after Christmas off and the two weeks after Spring Break off.

STEAM Day was a huge success. There were five centers that students rotated through, created by teachers and district staff. The teachers and staff are thinking of holding a STEAM Day every year. Thank you to the PTO who donated $\$ 500$ to this event.

The end of the $2^{\text {nd }}$ quarter is Friday. For 2nd quarter, grades will be online through Power School. The deadline for teachers to have grades in Power School is January 18.

Fall Fundraiser
Danielle Burrows stated that we are still are still receiving donations, but we are currently at just under $\$ 14,000$. The classroom winners were announced on December 21, 2018. For the amount of money raised, Mrs. Halterman's class got $1^{\text {st }}$ place and Mr. Bandy's class was $2^{\text {nd }}$. For the amount of class participation, Mrs. Ackelson's was in $1^{\text {st }}$ place and Mrs. Halterman's class came in $2^{\text {nd }}$. Mrs. Halterman's class won the movie party. For those students who earned prizes: the $t$-shirts have been ordered, magnets are here and they will all go out in February. Student Ava Banks was the winner of the Nintendo Switch. Feedback for future fundraisers would be appreciated.

Recap on Purchases
The new refrigerator was delivered and the old one removed. The kitchen has purchased their containers. The teachers are already utilizing the radios purchased through the Fall Fundraiser. Teachers have been purchasing items for their classrooms with the $\$ 100$ the PTO donated to them; feedback from the teachers has been positive and very appreciative.

Pancake Supper
Tara Rehmeier shared that we had 370 plates sold which is an increase of about 70 plates form past years. The Library sold over $\$ 10,000$ worth and $\$ 4,000$ of that was on the Pancake Supper night. This is
not a fundraiser for Irving; however, we did make \$204, which is being donated to the Irving library to purchase new books. Moving forward it was suggested that we do not ask for juice box donations, rather monetary donations so that we can have the same brand/flavor of juice boxes. Leftover water was used for the Pancake Supper.

Hospitality
Susan Krisko reported that we gave out gift cards to 47 staff members for Christmas. Parents donated the snacks. We will be asking parents to donate items for Spring Conferences for the evening of February 12, 2019.

MDA Coin Drive
Danielle Burrows announced that the MDA Coin Drive would take place after Spring Break.

## Buddy Benches

Danielle Burrows and Rusti Woods shared that the Girls Scouts are working to get a Buddy Bench at Irving. A buddy bench is an idea to eliminate loneliness and foster friendship on the playground. If a student feels they need someone to talk to or play with on the playground they can choose to sit on the buddy bench. The hope is that other students will see them and go ask if they want to play! Girl Scouts are collecting plastic lids to be melted and formed into a buddy bench. They need 250 pounds to make one buddy bench.

## Yearbook
