#### FAST Assessments

Screening is an assessment process that helps Indianola Middle School teachers identify students who are at risk for not meeting their grade-level's learning benchmarks. The results of the upcoming FAST Winter reading and math screeners will help our building make decisions regarding reading and math interventions, including those provided during WIN, Math Support and Project Read.

It is important that our middle school students give their best effort on the upcoming FASTBridge reading and math assessments. The FAST reading fluency assessments will begin the week of **January 17**, with the FASTtrack Reading assessment scheduled for **January 20**. The FASTtrack Math assessment is scheduled for **January 27**, **2022**.

Here is a summary of these assessments:

**AUTOreading** is an assessment of a student's automaticity with specific reading skills, including recognizing letter names and sounds, decoding words, identifying the correct spelling of words, word synonyms, and detecting differences in word meanings. AUTOreading is a computer-based test.

**aReading** is an assessment that screens a student's broad reading abilities. The assessment is based on research and each question is aligned with the National Common Core State Standards (2010). aReading is a computer-adaptive test and students respond to between 30 and 60 questions.

**FASTtrack Math** combines automaticity of basic math facts and the **aMath** assessment. aMath is an assessment that screens a student's broad math abilities. Each question in the assessment is aligned with the National Common Core State Standards (2010). aMath is a computer-adaptive test and students respond to between 30 and 60 questions.
