Dear Parents/Guardians,

We have exciting news! The students and staff at L. I. Wilder Elementary have an opportunity to put into action what we have been focusing on – kindness and doing for others. We are going to partner with Indianola residents, Nick and Typhanie Mahlstadt, and their nonprofit organization, The Move Project. This organization has recently finished the construction of an elementary school (preschool to 5^{th} grade) in Tsipasi, Ghana. It will serve about 200 students. This is an area of Africa where there has been no formal education, so adults are also being taught to read. Tsipasi is located about $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours from the capital city in a farming area. Therefore, their resources are very limited. We can help the adults and children of Tsipasi by providing some basic school supplies for them. These supplies include pencils, hand held pencil sharpeners, erasers, rulers with metric and customary units, and spiral notebooks (wide lined preferred). If you have other miscellaneous school supplies that you are not using, we can send those also. They also need low level (K – 2^{nd} grade) books so the adults and children can practice reading. (The books do not need to be new.) If your child would like to participate in this international act of kindness, he/she can bring any of the listed supplies or a book to school no later than January 10^{th} . This is strictly voluntary! Thank you for your support and generosity as our students begin to connect with a community halfway around the world.
