Dear Indianola High School *Freshman* Parents and Students,

Indianola High School is excited to continue moving our teaching and learning forward with our Digital Learning Environment (DLE). This year your student will receive a brand new 13" MacBook Air laptop to be used for curriculum, assessment and instruction while at school and at home. There are no fees associated with students receiving their MacBook Air.

All students and one parent/guardian must attend a designated orientation session. Orientation sessions will last approximately one hour. At this session students will receive their MacBook Air computer, receive basic care and usage instructions, as well as turn in the DLE agreement forms. The DLE orientation dates are listed below and are organized by last name. Please plan to attend the session that matches your student's last name.

We ask that you read the information in this letter carefully and review the Indianola DLE Student Handbook & Indianola Device Acceptance Agreement before the checkout dates listed below. They can found on our district website, www.indianola.k12.ia.us, under *Departments -> Information Technology -> Digital Learning Environment*. The Indianola Device Acceptance Agreement form must be <u>signed electronically</u> by a parent/guardian during the online registration / re-enrollment process <u>before</u> your student can be issued his/her device.

Due to the large number of devices to be distributed, please plan to attend your scheduled session. On the evening of orientation, signs will be posted at the main entrance of the high school directing parents and students to the location of their particular session. <u>Please plan to arrive 5-10 minutes prior to the start of your</u> <u>orientation time</u>.
