

"Replace in Place" Bond Vote

n Tuesday, September 13th the residents of the Indianola Community School District approved a bond vote for \$70 million dollars with over 85% of voters voting yes. Thanks to our community support, the district is able to move forward with the "Replace in Place" renovation project for Indianola High School.

Areas to be renovated in this plan include a new commons area to link the gym, auditorium and academic areas together to create a new "heart" for the building. A new two-story academic wing to be built to the west and athletic

and career/technical expansion to the north.



We are fortunate to live in a community that supports the school district and the education of our students. We appreciate the opportunity to serve our students and make sure they have high quality learning environments to meet their educational needs.

Work will begin this fall with staff finalizing the design of these spaces with an anticipation date of construction to begin in the fall of 2023. We look forward to sharing with our school community the next steps in the "Replace in Place" process as they develop.
