The Indianola Ice Rink located at 2204 W. 2nd Avenue was donated in 2018 to the city by the Iowa Wild and Wells Fargo.

The rink is installed and operated each year by Indianola Parks and Recreation.

The rink will not be supervised; all users will be skating at their own risk, with their own skates. Food, drink, and pets are not allowed on the ice. Shovels will be available for skaters to clear snow from the rink.

A green sign will be posted at the rink to indicate when the rink is open; a red sign will be posted when the rink is closed. Open/closed status will also be posted on the Parks & Recreation Facebook page.
